


GARLIC Ultra-early varieties

The ultra-early varieties are the first to arrive on the market (fresh or dry), kick-starting sales early in the season.

GARLIC Autumn purples, softneck varieties

Large bulbed distinctly purple autumn varieties. Ideal for selling dry or fresh, offering sales potential early in the season.

The earliest purple garlic

- Purple bulb
- Brown-coloured cloves
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety
- Very early ■ Low dormancy



VALDOUR

exclusive to TOP Semence

Slightly later, enabling staggered harvests!

- White striped purple bulb
- Dark beige-coloured
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety
- Very early
- Low dormancy



PARADOUR

Regular and well-formed!

■ Very early

■ Low dormancy

- Purple striped white bulb
- Brown-coloured cloves
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety



GARLIC Autumn whites, softneck varieties

These are autumn varieties with large white bulbs, typical of the Drôme area.

MESSIDOR



- White bulb
- Cream-coloured cloves
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety
- Early
- Average dormancy



THERMIDRÔME

Hardy variety

- White bulb, very low pre-
- sence of anthocyanins ■ Beige-coloured cloves
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety
- Early
- Average dormancy



MESSIDRÔME

Typical variety of white Garlic from the Drôme

- White bulb
- Cream-coloured cloves
- Regenerated OYDV virus-free variety
- - Early
 - Average dormancy






GARLIC Hardneck varieties

Flower stalk varieties, with a long shelf-life and very colourful cloves, for staggered harvests and sales.

High dormancy varieties, particularly good for long shelf-life. The pink colour often only becomes apparent after separating the cloves.







Due to the varietal diversity of shallots, there are many different bulb shapes and colours and planting and harvesting can be staggered. There are two main categories: the grey shallot and the Jersey type (or pink shallot).

- flesh
- Average storage time

Thick grey skin, purplish white






ONIONS

There are many varieties of onions in all shapes and colours on the market. They serve as both a vegetable and a condiment.

BRUNSWICK

- Hardv
- Large red slightly flattened bulb
- Late
- Very good shelf-life

WHITE EBENEZER SILVERMOON

- Early maturing, early produce
- Large white round bulb
- Hardy
- Average shelf-life

JAUNE PAILLE

- Large yellow flat bulb
- High yielding
- Good shelf-life







STUTTGARTER

- Large yellow slightly flattened bulb
- Very high yielding
- Good shelf-life



STURON

- Yellow round bulb
- Late, bolt-resistant
- High yielding
